CUE TEST 4 SPECIFICATIONS

(updated 6/09/2006)

What type of information is learned during cued-recall tests, as opposed to re-study opportunities, that contributes to better long-term retention?

<u>Task</u>: Learn <u>English-Swahili</u> pairs → cued-recall test vs. re-study → final test over all items.

Stimuli: 43 English-Swahili word pairs. Found in CueTestList.xls

English word is cue, and Swahili word is target. For each subject, **randomly** assign each item to Trial (e.g., Test or Study, as below) and Final Test (e.g., Forward or Backward or Day 1 Test, as below) conditions.




Design:

- 2 within-subjects trial conditions:
 - (1) <u>Test</u>: Present <u>English</u> → subject attempts retrieval of <u>Swahili</u> + feedback
 - (2) <u>Study</u>: Present <u>English</u> and <u>Swahili</u> together
- 3 within-subjects final test conditions:
 - (1) Forward: Recall Swahili from English
 - (2) <u>Backward</u>: Recall <u>English</u> from <u>Swahili</u>
 - (3) <u>Day 1 Test</u>: Randomly assign 3 of the Test items to be tested at the end of Day 1, and never seen again.

<u>Presentation phase</u>: Present all 43 pairs, for 6 sec each (6 sec x 43 pairs = 4.3 min).



<u>Test phase</u>: Present 23 pairs with <u>English</u> only for 4 sec, with instructions to covertly recall <u>Swahili</u> word. Then, present <u>English + Swahili</u> for 2 more sec (6 sec per pair total x 23 pairs = 2.3 min). For the first 4 seconds, put blank white box under "Swahili:" as shown below.



<u>Study phase</u>: Present the other 20 pairs with <u>English + Swahili</u> for 6 sec, with instructions to restudy <u>English and Swahili</u> words (6 sec per pair x 20 pairs = 2 min).

Present test and study phases in **blocked** fashion. For half of subjects, first 23 pairs are Test and second 20 pairs are Study, and for the other half of subjects, first 20 pairs are Study and second 23 pairs are Test.

Repeat Test phase and Study phase 2 more times. The same 23 word pairs are assigned to Test, and the same 20 word pairs are assigned to Study. Each time Test and Study phases are repeated, present the word pairs in a new random order. So, there are 3 repetitions of Test and Study phases. Each repetition is presented in the same **blocked** fashion, where for half of the subjects, the first 23 pairs are Test and second 20 pairs are Study, and for the other half of subjects, first 20 pairs are Study and second 23 pairs are Test.

<u>Day 1 Test</u>: Randomly choose 3 items, and repeat Test phase, but this time requiring subjects to type in their answer. No time limit for retrieval, and no feedback. These 3 items are never seen again in the experiment.

<u>Final test</u>: 24 hours after test/study phase. Out of the 20 word pairs that were assigned to Test Trials on Day 1 (23 word pairs, minus 3 for Day 1 Test, leaves 20), 10 of these are given the Forward Test and 10 are given the Backward Test on Day 2. Out of the 20 items that were assigned to Study Trials on Day 1, 10 of these are given the Forward Test and 10 are given the Backward Test on Day 2.

• Forward Test: Present English words one at a time in new random order, and require subject to type in Swahili word. No time limit for retrieval, and no feedback. (≈ 5 sec for retrieval of each target x 20 targets = 1.67 min). Put blank white box under "Swahili," as shown below, and allow subjects to type their answers into this box

• Backward Test: Present Swahili words one at a time in new random order, and require subject to type in English word. No time limit for retrieval, and no feedback. (≈ 5 sec for retrieval of each cue x 20 cues = 1.67 min). Put blank white box under "Swahili," as shown below, and allow subjects to type their answers into this box.

Total time to complete: 3 min for consent and instructions + Presentation phase (4.3 min) + [[Test phase (3.38 min) + Study phase (3.33 min)] x 3 = 12.9 min] + Final test (1.67 x 2 = 3.34 min) = 16.24 min.

Subjects: 40 UCSD undergrads.

<u>Data:</u> Keep track of the following for each individual subject:

- 1) Which word pairs were assigned to Test and Study Trials on Day 1
- 2) Which word pairs were assigned to Day 1 Test on Day 1
- 3) Accuracy of response for the 3 word pairs tested on the Day 1 Test
- 4) Accuracy of responses for the Final Test
 - Number of words correct that were assigned to Test Trials on Day 1 and Forward Test on Day 2.
 - Number of words correct that were assigned to Study Trials on Day 1 and Forward Test on Day 2.
 - Number of words correct that were assigned to Test Trials on Day 1 and Backward Test on Day 2.
 - Number of words correct that were assigned to Study Trials on Day 1 and Backward Test on Day 2.

Instructions:

<u>Instructions 1</u>:

In this experiment we are going to try and teach you some Swahili words. You will learn the meaning of several Swahili words by seeing them next to their English translations, as in the example below:

English:	Swahili:

The word pairs will be presented one at a time, for 6 seconds each. When you see each word pair, try to associate the Swahili word with the English word in order to remember them.

Press the spacebar to begin.

<u>Instructions for Test and Study</u>: (after all word pairs are presented)

Now things are going to get more interesting! We are going to present the word pairs again, only this time they will be presented differently.

For some of the word pairs, you will see both the English word and Swahili word again for 6 seconds. Again, we would like you to try and associate the Swahili word with the English word in order to remember them.

For other word pairs, you will see only the English word for 4 seconds (Sky: _____), and we would like you to try and remember the correct Swahili word that goes with it (Hewa). You do not have to type anything in. Just try to recall in your mind the correct Swahili word that goes with the English word. After the English word is presented alone for 4 seconds, the correct Swahili word will be presented for an additional 2 seconds, so you can see whether you remembered correctly.

At the end of today's Session, we will test your memory for 3 of these word pairs. You will be paid \$2.00 for each word pair you remember, so please try your best to learn ALL of the word pairs you are about to see.

Press the spacebar to begin.

Instructions before repeating Test and Study phase the second time:

Now we are going to show you the same word pairs again. If you see the English and Swahili words together, try to associate the Swahili word with the English word in order to remember them. If you see the English word alone (Sky: _____), please try to remember the correct Swahili word that goes with it.

At the end of today's Session, we will test your memory for 3 of these word pairs. You will be paid \$2.00 for each word pair you remember, so please try your best to learn ALL of the word pairs you are about to see.

<u>Instructions before repeating Test and Study phase the third time:</u>

Now we are going to show you the same word pairs again, for one last time. If you see the English and Swahili words together, try to associate the Swahili word with the English word in order to remember them. If you see the English word alone (Sky: _____), please try to remember the correct Swahili word that goes with it.

At the end of today's Session, we will test your memory for 3 of these word pairs. You will be paid \$2.00 for each word pair you remember, so please try your best to learn ALL of the word pairs you are about to see.

<u>Instructions for Day 1 Test</u>: (after Test and Study phases)

Now we will test your memory for 3 of the word pairs you just learned. On the next screen, you will see an English word by itself. Try to remember the Swahili word that goes with it, and type this word into the empty box.

Press the spacebar to begin.

<u>Instructions for end of Day 1</u>: (after Day 1 Test)

This completes Session 1. Please be sure to return at your scheduled time tomorrow to complete Session 2 and receive credit.

<u>Instructions for final test</u>: (Day 2)

Now we are going to quiz you over what you learned yesterday. For some of the word pairs, the English word will be presented, and we would like you to type in the correct Swahili word that goes with it.


For example, you will see an English word by itself like the one below:

For this English word, you would type in the correct Swahili word, which is Hewa. This is the same type of test you completed yesterday.

For other word pairs, you will receive a different type of test. The Swahili word will be presented, and we would like you to type in the correct English word that goes with it.

For example, you will see a Swahili word by itself like the one below:



For this Swahili word, you would type in the correct English word, which is Sky.

You have unlimited time to complete this test. Although some of the words might be difficult to remember, please try your best, and enter a response even if you are uncertain.

Press the spacebar to begin.
